ORDINANCES FOR MASTER OF ARTS EXAMINATIONS

(SEMESTER SYSTEM)

For Regular/Distance Education/Private Students

Applicability of Ordinances for the time being in force

Notwithstanding the integrated nature of a course spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinances in force at the time a student joins a course shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year. Nothing in these ordinances shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the ordinances subsequently and the amended ordinances, if any, shall apply to all the students whether old or new.

- 1. The examination for the degree of Master of Arts shall be held in four parts to be called M.A. Semester-I, M.A. Semester-II, M.A. Semester-III and M.A. Semester-IV. The Examination of odd semester shall be held in the months of December/January and the examination of even semesters shall be held in the months of April/ May or such other dates as may be fixed by the University.
- 2. (a) (i) The candidates will be required to pay examination fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- (ii) Last dates by which the examination forms and fees for the external examinations must reach the Controller of Examinations shall be as follows:-

- (b) Candidates shall submit their admission forms and fee for admission to the examination countersigned by the authorities as mentioned in the relevant Ordinances. For improvement of marks/division. the fee will be the same as prescribed for Private candidates and will be charged for each semester.
- 3. The following shall be the subjects out of which a candidate can offer one OR such other subjects as approved by the University:

English, Hindi, Punjabi, Urdu, Persian, Sanskrit, History, Economics, Political Science, Philosophy. Public Administration, Sociology, Defence and Strategic Studies, Anthropological Linguistics and Punjabi Language, Religious Studies. Theatre and Television., Social Work. Fine Arts, Music (Instrumental and Vocal), Folk Art and Culture, Psychology, Dance, Education, Journalism and Mass Communication, Gurumat Sangeet & Sikh Studies.

- 4. (i) The medium of examination for subjects in the Faculty of languages shall be the language concerned and for other subjects English or Punjabi.
 - (ii) The medium of examinations for M.A. Music, Dance, Fine Arts, Folk Art Culture and Theatre and Television, shall be Punjabi, English and Hindi.

Provided that candidates for M.A. Sanskrit and M.A. Persian examination shall be permitted at their option .to offer medium of examination as under:

M.A. Sanskrit

Sanskrit or Hindi or Punjabi

M.A. Persian

Persian or Urdu or Punjabi.

5. The syllabus be such as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

6. Each paper will consist of 100 Marks, For Regular and Distance Education students, 30% for internal assessment/Practical/Seminar etc. shall be as per requirement of the department. There will be no internal assessment for private students.

For regular and distance education students, the minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be 35% marks in external assessment in each paper separately in theory and practical and 35% in aggregate of internal, external theory and practical. For private students, the pass marks will be 35% in each paper.

Note: The Internal Assessment will be formulated and sent to COE as per prescribed schedule. failing which the result of concerned candidates will be shown as RL.

7. There will be no condition of passing papers for promotion from odd semester to even semester in an Academic Session.

To qualify for admission to 2nd year of the Course, the candidate must have passed 50% of total papers of the two semesters of the lst year.

A candidate placed under reappear in any paper, will be allowed two chances to clear the reappear, which shall be available within consecutive two years/chances i.e. to pass in a paper the candidate will have a total of three chances, one as regular student and two as reappear candidate.

Provided that he shall have to qualify in all the papers prescribed for M.A. course within a period of four years from the date he joins the course. In case, he fails to do so within the prescribed period of four years as aforesaid he shall be declared fail.

The examination of reappear papers of odd semester will be held with regular examination of the odd semester and reappear examination of the even semester will be held with regular examination of even semester. But if a candidate is placed under reappear in the last semester of the course, he will be provided chance to pass the reappear with the examination of the next semester, provided his reappear of lower semester does not go beyond next semester. It is understood that a reappear or failed candidate shall be allowed to take the examination in papers not cleared by him according to the date sheets of the semester examinations in which such papers may be adjusted. After completing two years of studies (i.e. four semester course) he shall not be admitted to any semester of the same course and will not have any privileges of a regular student.

- 8. The grace marks shall be allowed according to the general ordinances relating to 'Award of Grace Marks', These ordinance will apply to all the examination.
 - Upto 1% of the total marks of Part-I and II examination shall be added to the aggregate of both Part -1 & 11 examinations to award a higher division/ 55% marks, to a candidate.
 - (ii) Grace marks given shall be calculated on the basis of 1 % of total aggregate marks of all the written and practical papers of the examination concerned. Marks for viva-voce /internal assessment /sessional work/skill in teaching /any addition into account for this purpose. If a fraction al/optional subject shall not be taken works out to half or more, it shall count as one mark and fraction less than half be ignored.
 - (iii) To pass in one or more written papers or subjects, and /or to make up the the examination but not in practical, sessional work, internal aggregate to pass assessment, viva-voce and skill in teaching.
- 9. * Three weeks after the termination of the examination or as soon as thereafter as possible the Registrar shall publish a list of candidates who have passed the examination candidate in Semester-I, successful semester. Each each II, Semester III and Semester-IV examinations shall receive a certificate of having passed that examination. A list of successful candidates in the Part-II examination three Divisions according to Ordinance 10 and the division be arranged in obtained by the candidate will be stated in his Degree.

MASTER OF LIBRARY & INFORMATION . SCIENCE COURSE

- 1. The duration of Master of Library and Information Science (MLISc.) course shall be one academic year and the examination will be divided into two parts viz. Part-I at the end of First Semester and Part-II at the end of Second Semester. The examination in Part -I will be held in December/January and Part-II in April/May or on such other dates as may be fixed by the Academic Council
- 2) The first semester examination shall be open to a person who:
 - i) Has passed Bachelor of Library and Information Science examination with at least 50% marks from this university.

OF

Such examination from any other University recognized as equivalent there to by this University with at least 50% marks.

- ii) A) Satisfies the following requirements:
 - a) Has been on the rolls of the Department throughout the Semester preceding the examination;
 - b) Has his name submitted to the Registrar by the Head of the Department and produces the following certificate signed by the Head of the Department, having a good moral character.

OR

- B) Has completed the prescribed course of instruction for the examination but has not appeared or having appeared has failed/ or is placed under reappear and is recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the college for admission to the examination without attending a fresh course of instruction within two subsequent consecutive chances from the date of completion of the course. A candidate who fails to clear the examination in the given chances, shall be required to join the course *de-novo*.
- 3. The Second Semester examination shall be open to a person who:
 - Has passed Bachelor of Library and Information Science examination with at least 50% marks from this university.

OR

Such examination from any other University recognized as equivalent there to by this University with at least 50% marks.

ii) A) Satisfies the following requirements:

- a) Has been on the rolls of the Department throughout the Semester preceding the examination;
- b) Has his name submitted to the Registrar by the Head of the Department and produces the following certificate signed by the Head of the Department having a good moral character.

OR

- B) Has completed the prescribed course of instruction for the examination but has not appeared or having appeared has failed/ or is placed under reappear and is recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the college for admission to the examination without attending a fresh course of instruction within two subsequent consecutive chances from the date of completion of the course. A candidate who fails to clear the examination in the given chances, shall be required to join the course *de-novo*.
- 4) i) Every candidate will be required to attend 75% attendance periods delivered in each paper. Teaching/Seminars/Tutorial/Practicals/Guided Library Reading period of 1 hour's duration will be counted as 1 attendance.

 The department shall be required to deliver at least 75% of the total number of lectures prescribed for each paper Provided that a deficiency in attendances may be condoned for special reasons, as per the relevant ordinances on the Subject
 - ii) In case of students whose names are struck off on account of non-payment of fee their periods, for the time they were not on the rolls, shall not be accounted for.
- 5. The last date by which the admission forms and fees for the examination should reach the Registrar shall be as follows:

- 6. a) The Candidate will be required to pay examination fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.
 - b) Candidates shall submit their application forms for admission to the examination, countersigned by the Head of the Department.
- 7. The admission of a student will be cancelled on continuous absence from the classes for two weeks from the commencement of the teaching work in the course unless he or she gives in writing such reason for absence as are acceptable to the authorities.

- 8. The medium of examination shall be English or Punjabi.
- 9. The Syllabus for the course shall be such as prescribed by Academic Council from time to time.
- 10. There will be eight papers as indicated in schemes of papers of the syllabus, four each in first and second semester examinations.
- Practical examination for each paper having marks for practical examination shall be conducted by a committee consisting of:
 - a) Teacher (s) who have taught the concerned paper during the semester.
 - b) Head of the Department or his nominee.
- 12. One week before the commencement of second semester writing examination, the candidates will submit three type written copies of Dissertation/Project work report in Paper (b) to the Head of the Department accompanied by a certificate from the Supervisor testifying that the candidate has undertaken the work. However, on the recommendation of Head of the Department, Dean of the Faculty may grant extension up to three weeks after the end of second semester written examination for submission of Dissertation to a candidate for sufficient reasons. In case a candidate fails to submit Dissertation/Project work report within the stipulated

period he / she will be placed under reappear with a topic on the recommendation of the ACD. Re-evaluation of dissertation/project work report is not allowed.

- 13. A candidate who obtains 50% of the total marks (50% in internal assessment and practical examination taken together, and 50% in written examination) of the paper shall be considered pass in that paper.
- 14. i) A candidate who fails/does not appear in any / all papers in First semester examination shall be allowed to reappear in those paper(s) in two subsequent consecutive chances.

- ii) A candidate who fails in one or more papers in second semester examination shall be allowed to reappear in those paper(s) in two subsequent consecutive chances.
- Subject to above ordinances there will be no condition of passing papers for promotion from odd semester to even semester in an Academic Session.

A candidate placed under reappear in any paper, will be allowed two chances to clear the reappear, which should be availed within consecutive two year/ chances i.e. to pass in a paper the candidate will have a total of three chances, one as regular student and two as reappear candidate.

- iv) The grace marks shall be given as admissible under Ordinances relating to the 'Award of Grace Marks'.
- v) Internal assessment marks for each paper by reappear candidates on completion of the semester shall be carried forward for all subsequent consecutive chances where the candidate is eligible for reappear.
- 15. Four weeks after the termination of the examination or as soon as may be, the Registrar shall publish a list of candidates who have passed the examination.
- 16. Successful candidates who obtain 60% or more of the aggregate number of marks in first and second semester examination shall be placed in the First Division and all those who obtain 50% or more but less than 60% number of marks shall be placed in the Second Division. Candidates who secure 75% or more marks in a paper shall be awarded distinction in that paper. Candidates securing 75% or more marks in aggregate shall be awarded First Division with Distinction.
- 17. A candidate who has passed from this university may be allowed to re-appear as a private candidate for improving division/score. For this purpose, he/she will be given two chance within a period of two years from the year of passing the Master of Library & Information Science examination as per university rules. However, improvement will be not allowed in the practical papers. The result of such a candidate shall be declared only if he/she improves his/her division/score. Otherwise his/her result will be declared P.R.S. (Pervious Result Stands)

ORDINANCES FOR BACHELOR OF COMMERCE

- 1. B.Com is an integrated course comprising three parts spread over three years. Each part will consist of two semesters. The course of study of B.Com shall be divided in six semesters and university examination will be held at the end of every semester in the months of December/January (for semester I,III &V) and April/May (for semester II, IV & VI) or as fixed by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 2. The examination in B.Com. Part-I shall be open to a student who produces the following certificates to the Principal of the college.
- (i) of having passed at least +2 examination of Punjab School Education Board or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with at least
 - (a) 40% marks in the aggregate in case of students who have passed 10+2 Committee group.

OR

(b) 45% marks in the aggregate in case of students who have passed 10+2 in Humanities group with at least two out of Commerce/Accounts/Math/ Economics/Management papers.

OR

(c) 50% marks in the aggregate in case of students who have passed 10+2 but not covered under (a) and (b) above.

OR

(d) Students who opt for any of the vocational subjects in the B.Com. course should have passed with atleast 50% marks, 10+2 examination from Punjab School Education Board or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

Note: Candidate placed under reappear in one or more subjects in 10+2 examination of Punjab School Education Board or any other examination, recognized as equivalent thereto shall not be eligible for admission to B.Com. Part-I Course.

- (ii) of having remained on the rolls of a college admitted to the privileges of the University for the academic year preceding the examinations.
- (iii) Of having good character
- 3. A candidate must complete and pass the whole course of three years within a maximum of six years from the date of admission in B.Com first semester.
- 4. Semester examinations will be open to regular candidates who have been on the rolls of a college affiliated to this University and meet the attendance and other requirements as prescribed in the ordinances of the course.

5. Subject to fulfillment of requirement of House examinations, the attendance requirements and these ordinances, there will be no condition of passing papers for promotion from odd semester to even semester in an Academic Session.

To qualify for admission to 2rd year of the Course, the candidate must have passed 50% of total papers of the two semesters of the 1st year. Similarly, to qualify for admission to 3rd year of the course, the candidate should have passed 50% of total papers of four semesters of the earlier two years.

A candidate placed under reappear in any paper, will be allowed two chances to clear the reappear, which should be availed within consecutive two years/chances i.e. to pass in a paper the candidate will have a total of three chances, one as regular student and two as reappear candidate.

The examination of reappear papers of odd semester will be held with regular examination of the odd semester and reappear examination of even semester with the even semester. But if a candidate is placed under reappear in the last semester of the course, he will be provided chance to pass the reappear with the examination of the next semester, provided his reappear of lower semester does not go beyond next semester.

6. Attendance Requirements

Every candidate will be required to attend a minimum of 75% lectures delivered to that class in each paper as well as 75% of the laboratory work, seminars etc, separately. Provided that a deficiency in attendances may be condoned for special reasons, as per the relevant ordinances on the subject.

- 7. To be eligible to appear in the semester examination a candidate must have obtained in the house examination at least 25% marks in each paper; 33% marks in the aggregate of all subjects of the semester. The Principal at his discretion may allow a special test to a candidate who could not appear in the House examination owing to unavoidable reasons or fails to secure the minimum marks as prescribed above.
- 8. Late college students: A candidate who has completed the prescribed course of instructions for a semester but has not appeared in the examination or having appeared, has failed in the examination, may appear as a late college student within the prescribed period.
- 9. The pass and reappear students of B.Com Part-II and III from any other recognized University shall be treated at par with the corresponding students of this University. But in case such a student is admitted in B.Com. Part-II semester III or V in this University, he/she will be required to clear deficient papers, if any.
- 10. Applications for admission to the examination shall be made on the prescribed form attested by the competent authority as per University rules.

11. Amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for each semester shall be as fixed by the University from time to time.

- 15. All the question papers except Punjabi and English will be set both in English and Punjabi and candidates can answer the questions either in English or Punjabi or Hindi. The paper in Punjabi language will be set in Punjabi only and candidate will be required to answer in Punjabi only.
- 16. The minimum number of marks required to pass each semester examination will be 35% in each paper and 40% in the aggregate of the semester examination. Provided that in papers with practicals, the percentage shall be required separately in written and practical/lab work. The candidate shall also be entitled to grace marks as admissible under the general ordinance relating to the 'Award of Grace Marks'.

his/her internal marks obtained during regular semester will be consider and carried forward.

(b) If a student gets 'D' grade (Detained) in a subject then he /she will have to appear in reappear exam as well as Internal Examination. However Internal Examination in this case will carry maximum marks equal to the total Internal Marks. E.g. If Internal Weightage is 30% of total 100 marks for a paper then this special Internal Test will be of 30 Marks. Candidate will submit application to Head of Department for this Purpose.



MASTER OF ARTS FACULTY OF LANGUAGES (M.A.)

Applicability of Ordinances for the time being in force

Notwithstanding the integrated nature of a course spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinances in force at the time a student joins a course shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year. Nothing in these ordinances shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the ordinances subsequently and the amended ordinances, if any, shall apply to all the students whether old or new.

- The M.A. course shall be spread over two academic years consisting of four semesters-I to IV. This Programme has been designed as per Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) introduced by the UGC.
- The following shall be the subjects out of which a candidate can offer one or such other subjects as approved by the University:
 - English, Punjabi, Hindi, Urdu, Persian, Sanskrit, Anthropological Linguistics and Punjabi Language.
- 3. Admission to the M.A. Part-I in the above subjects shall be given to a candidate on merit based on marks obtained in B.A./B.A. (Hons.). Preference will be given to a candidate who has passed B.A. with the concerned subject as an elective. Minimum eligibility is 50% marks (45% for SC/ST candidates) in aggregate in B.A. examination.
- The end-semester examination for I and III semesters i.e., odd semesters shall be held in the month of November/December and for the II and IV semesters i.e., even semester in the month of May/June or on other dates as may be decided by Punjabi University.
- The outlines of course scheme, syllabi and credits for a paper/subject shall be prescribed by the University from time to time.
- The candidate shall be required to submit duly completed admission and examination forms along with applicable fee as per prescribed norms within the stipulated specified period in each of the semesters to the Punjabi University / concerned Department.
- (i)The medium of instruction / examination for subjects in the Faculty of Languages shall be the language concerned and for other subjects English or Punjabi.
 - (ii)Provided that candidates for M.A. Sanskrit and M.A. Persian examination shall be permitted at their option to offer medium of examination as under:

M.A. Sanskrit

Sanskrit or Hindi or Punjabi

M.A. Persian

Persian or Urdu or Punjabi

The M.A. course shall consist of 80 credits (in case of M.A. in Punjabi -100 credits).
 Further details of teaching hours, marks and credits allocated to each course shall be given in the respective Syllabi.

- 9. Broadly, the structure of the said M.A. Programme shall be as given below:
 - A. Core Courses: A course, which should be studied compulsorily by a candidate as a necessary requirement is termed as a Core course.
 - B. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses: Elective courses offered under the main discipline / subject of study shall be referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
 - C. Open Elective (OE) Courses: Open Elective courses offered under the unrelated discipline/subject to seek exposure beyond main discipline of choice shall be referred to as Open Elective courses.

NOTE: The candidate will be allowed to opt for Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) in lieu of open elective courses only. MOOC courses are available on SWAYAM platform of Government of India, shall be offered through online mode. The subjects which the students can opt from MOOC's will be notified by the department semester-wise from time to time.

D. Compulsory Qualifying Paper (CQP) - Not Applicable to M.A. in Punjabi

There will be one CQP to be designed and approved by BOS of the concerned department. The syllabus for this paper will correspond to relevant topics of the concerned subject to be taught in Punjabi by the faculty of the department of Physics. Alternatively, a relevant course from MOOC with medium of instruction / examination as Punjabi can be opted as CQP by a student with prior permission of the Head of Department. The students who have qualified Punjabi at Matriculation level / higher level will study this paper.

However, students from Punjab / Other states who have not studied / qualified Punjabi at any level shall study Mudla Gayan paper to be offered by the Department of Punjabi.

- 9. Evaluation criteria in theory papers, Grading Definitions, passing criteria, Detainee criteria and Improvement conditions will be as per the details given below:
- 9.1 Evaluation criteria

A. Theory papers (Core paper / DSE / OE)

There shall be internal evaluation component with a weightage of 30% of the total allocated marks for that paper (Core paper / DSE / OE). This evaluation will be based on the mid semester test (MST) (weightage ~50% of total allocated marks for internal evaluation) and continuous evaluation through class assignments/seminars/presentations etc. (weightage ~35% of total allocated marks for internal evaluation) and attendance (weightage ~15% of total allocated marks for internal evaluation) in each subject.

The question paper for MST (1 hour duration) will consist of long and short-answer questions.

A special MST in a given subject will be conducted during last week of the semester by the subject teacher / Committee for students who failed to appear in scheduled MST because of some genuine reason (such as illness, appearance in SSB interview, participation in university event etc.).

The end-semester examination for theory papers shall carry a weightage of 70% of the total allocated marks for that paper and will be of 3 hours duration. The question paper will consist of three sections, namely, Section A, B and C. Section A and B will have four

- se ayou

questions each from the respective sections of the syllabus. Each question will carry equal marks (12 marks each) and may consists of sub-parts. A student will be required to attempt two questions from each of the section A and B. The section C will be compulsory with 11 short-answer type questions covering the entire syllabus (2 marks each).

In the theory papers, the subject teacher will display the answer sheets and the marks secured by a student in the mid semester test (MST) along with all breakup details of total internal evaluation at the end of the semester.

The end-semester examination will be conducted by the Examination branch of the Punjabi University. After getting the theory paper checked, a list of total marks (including Internal and External Marks) will be prepared and letter grades will be awarded by the Examination branch of Punjabi University.

The students will be declared "Pass" in a theory paper if he/she secures a minimum of 40% marks in the internal evaluation and the end semester examination jointly. If a student fails to secure minimum prescribed 40% marks, then result of such a paper will be declared as "Fail".

9.2 The grace marks shall be allowed to the student as per general ordinances of Punjabi University, Patiala relating to 'Award of Grace Marks',

9.3 The examination branch of Punjabi University, Patiala will award one of the Letter Grades and corresponding Grade Points to each student in each paper, as per the range of marks obtained specified in the first column of the table given below:

Here, each letter grade indicates the level of performance of a student in a paper and has a grade point for the purpose of computing the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

SGPA is the weighted average of all the grades awarded to a student in a given semester and computed as follows:

Where C, denotes credits assigned to the in paper and G, indicates the grade point equivalent to the letter grade obtained by the student in the in paper in a particular semester.

CGPA is the weighted average of all the grades awarded to a student since his/her entry into the University up to and including the latest semester and computed as follows:

Where C denotes credits assigned to the i* paper and G, indicates the grade point equivalent to the letter grade obtained by the student in the i* paper in that semester.

10. A student pursuing the M.A. course shall be required to earn at least 50% credits at the end of each year (odd and even semester taken together) of the program. In case he / she earns less than 50% credits in a given year (odd and even semester taken together) of the program, the student will be declared as having failed in that year and will have to seek readmission to the ODD semester of that specific year.

Additionally, the following conditions must also be met:

- i. Has been on the rolls of the department throughout the semester preceding the examination.
- ii. Has attained the required 75% of attendance of the delivered number of periods in each paper/subject. Period of one hour duration shall be counted as one attendance.
- iii. For late admission, the counting of lectures will be considered from the date of deposit of fees.
- iv. In case of a student, whose name has been struck off on account of non-payment of fees, their periods for the time they were not on the rolls, shall not be accounted for the completion of the total period of degree.
- v. The shortage of attendance of lectures by the candidate may be condoned as per rules framed by the University from time to time.
- 11. A maximum of three consecutive or successive chances will be given to students with "F" or "D" grades in specific subjects/papers to "PASS" in these papers. However, there will be no bar on the number of such papers in which the candidate can appear in a given semester. Such students will be required to deposit the requisite fee as notified by University from time to time for theory paper(s) and submit the examination form within stipulated period.

During the tenure of the M.A., the reappear examination of odd or even Semester Subjects shall be offered only in odd or even semesters respectively. However, the students of 4th Semester (Final Year of M.A.) will be allowed to clear backlogs pertaining to any of the previous semesters as per Punjabi University norms.

12. A student with "F" grade will have to appear in END SEM Exam (Theory) as stipulated at clause 9.1 and his marks in internals (weightage of 30% of total marks) secured earlier, when he/she attended the classes of that course / subject on regular basis, will be carried forward.

A student with "D" grade will have to appear in END SEM Exam (Theory) paper as stipulated at 9.1. In addition to this such a student has to appear for Internal exam also. For Internal exam (Theory) the student will have to submit a written application to the Head of department, who in turn will arrange to conduct the internal examination within the semester. In this case the question paper / internal exam will be of maximum weightage of 30% of total marks and 2 hours duration to be set from Section A of the syllabus. Pattern of question paper will be same as that for the End semester exam.

13. After the End-semester examination and completion of the evaluation process, the subject teacher for the paper shall submit the award lists through the Head of the Department to the Controller of Examinations.

The final/external exam for the papers will be conducted by examination branch of Punjabi University, Patiala and the University shall publish the result of the candidates after compilation of all total marks and the letter grades will be awarded to the students based on marks obtained by them out of 100 (as per clause 9.3).

At the end of every semester, each candidate shall receive a result card/certificate indicating the Grades scored in different subjects along with the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). Successful candidates at the end of the X Semester shall receive a degree stating the division as per the clause 14 given below.


14. Definition of Division of M.A. Degree

- (a) Successful candidates who obtain a CGPA of 6 or more of all the four semesters taken together shall be placed in First Division, those who obtain a CGPA of 5 or more but less the 6 shall be placed in Second Division. Candidates who obtain a CGPA of 7.5 or more shall be placed in the First Division with Distinction.
- (b) To convert CGPA into percentage of marks, a multiplying factor of 10 (Ten) shall be used. That is, 'Percentage of marks = CGPA x 10, (For example, a CGPA of 7.5 shall be equal to $7.5 \times 10 = 75 \%$),
- 15. The maximum time allowed to complete the requirements for the award of M.A. degree shall be four Years.

16. Improvement of Grades

The students, who have completed their M.A. degree, will be given chances to improve the overall percentage as per the following conditions:

- A candidate can apply to improve his/her grades in maximum of 50% of the total number
 of theory papers studied in the M.A. course. These papers can be taken from any of the
 four semesters in which he/she had scored B and C grades only. Improvement in subjects
 with grades B+ or higher will not be allowed.
 - The student will be given only one chance for improvement in each selected paper in the immediate two years after passing the M.A. course. This chance will be offered during the end-semester examination schedule of November /December and May/June only.
 - Further, candidate has to select papers from odd Semester while availing an improvement chance in odd Semester and has to select papers from even Semester while availing an improvement chance in even semester.
- 11 The improvement fee will be charged as per university norms notified from time to time.
- III A ceiling clause on grades will applicable defined as "The candidate can score maximum B+ grade in any of the improvement paper".
